# Towards an understanding of the creative collaboration of the Writer, Director and Producer.

Two key concepts will form a continuous theme throughout the conference: the nature of productive collaboration, and the integration of training for all three roles in the School curriculum.

#### Day 1 - 9th December - The relationship between Writer and Director

Although the trend is growing, the number of schools and academies with distinct and separate courses for writers for the moving image is still comparatively small. Most schools still support the concept of the "auteur", the writer/director student, and offer story development and script teaching only as a component of an over-all, integrated curriculum. At the same time, the industry itself is increasingly searching for new writers with new ideas. If schools are to meet this demand, a fundamental reappraisal of the training programme for screenwriters is necessary. The model we plan to describe is the Italian model, where the responsability of the script is shared between Writer and Director. At the same time, the Italian cinema has benefitted from the broad practice of group-writing that is also worth exploring.

Even in schools with established specialised courses for the training of producers, the integration of these students within the school programme as a whole is often complex and difficult. Some schools prefer to concentrate on the training of production managers as support crew rather than to develop "creative entrepreneurs". The industrial model we plan to describe is the British model, taking into special consideration the role of Television Networks, which have also been active in supporting feature film production. Through the influence of these companies, the figure of the script editor has come to play a significant role in the normal process of script development.
