Recent years have brought many challenges, new phenomena and technological changes that not only students, but also teachers and universities are struggling with. We are facing a new era in animation art and industry which we must adopt. Thematic meetings within the animation education community are vibrant opportunities for fostering innovation, collaboration, and networking. One such event - themed around the challanges of use of AI in animation education - brings together educators, students, and industry professionals to discuss the transformative role of artificial intelligence (AI) in animation pedagogy and strengthen inter-institutional connections. AI has rapidly evolved to become a game-changer in the animation industry. Tools powered by AI can generate realistic movements, automate labor-intensive tasks like in-betweening, and enhance visual effects production. However,

# Tallinn Film BIP (Blended Intensive Programme) Week, September 1-6: Baltic Film School Offers Several Courses to Students

The team at BFM asked us to share this information with you.

During the Tallinn Film BIP Week, BFM will host 7 courses on different aspects of filmmaking. Courses are primarily aimed at the 2nd and (3rd year) students of . directing, producing, cinematography, screenwriting, sound desig, editing, production design and acting.

Each course is 4 ECTS = 40 academic hours of contact classes + online class.

### Courses include:

- Rehearsal techniques: for acting and directing students. Directing students will be observers and their number is limited to 4. 16 open (i.e., 12 actors and 4 observing directors), dl for actors July 15.
- Script Supervisor / Continuity workshop: Primarily for editing students but also open to other professions. (16)
- Green Production: For production students (21)
- Gaffer, Best Boy, Electrician, Grip and Rigging Workshop: For cinematography students (11)
- Sound on Set: For sound design students (16)
- Costume designer's workshop: For production design students (21)
- Screenplay editor: script coverage and feedback techniques: For screenwriting students (16)
